IN HAND SHOWING CLASSES

PLEASE NOTE

The age of the handler for all In Hand Classes, both at the Qualifier Shows and at the Championships are as follows;

- a) Handlers of ponies 148cms and under must be 12 years old and over*
- b) Handlers of horses over 148cms must be 14 years old and over*

Classes to commence at 0900 prompt

Class 1: In Hand Youngstock

THIS IS NOT AN EQUESTRIAN LIFE QUALIFYING CLASS

Please see Mooreland Stables Rules for this class

Class 2: In-Hand Veteran

Open to horses and ponies, mare or gelding, 15 years old and over.

This class will be split at the Championships into the following sections:

- a) Horses/Ponies 15 -21 years old*
- b) Horses/Ponies Over 21 years old*

The highest placed THREE exhibitors not already qualified and with a valid 2010 Equestrian Life Registration Card will qualify for the Championships

Class 3: In-Hand Mountain and Moorland

Open to pure breeds only, mare or gelding, four years old and over.

NO STALLIONS ALLOWED

This class will be split at the Championships into the following sections:

- a) Small Breeds: Shetland, Dartmoor, Exmoor, Welsh Section A and B.*
- b) Large Breeds: Highland, Dales, Fell, New Forest, Connemara, Welsh Section C and D.*

The highest placed THREE exhibitors not already qualified and with a valid 2010 Equestrian Life Registration Card will qualify for the Championships

Class 4: In-Hand Coloured

PLEASE NOTE Roans, Duns, Cremello and Palomino horses and ponies are not permitted to enter the In Hand Coloured Class

Open to Piebald/Skewbald Native / Non Native, horses and ponies, mare or gelding, four years old and over.

This class will be split at the Championships into the following sections:

- a) 148cms and under.*
- b) over 148cms*

The highest placed THREE exhibitors not already qualified and with a valid 2010 Equestrian Life Registration Card will qualify for the Championships

Class 5: In-Hand Horse

Open to horses exceeding 148cms, any type, mare or gelding, four years old and over.
The highest placed THREE exhibitors not already qualified and with a valid
2010 Equestrian Life Registration Card will qualify for the Championships

Class 6: In-Hand Pony

Open to ponies not to exceed 148cms, any type, mare or gelding, four years old and over.
NO MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND PONIES ALLOWED IN THIS CLASS
The highest placed THREE exhibitors not already qualified and with a valid 2010 Equestrian Life
Registration Card will qualify for the Championships

Class 7: In Hand Cob

THIS IS NOT AN EQUESTRIAN LIFE QUALIFYING CLASS

Any age, any height

Followed by: In Hand Championship

RIDDEN SHOWING CLASSES (Not before 1200)

Class 8: Ridden Veteran

Open to horses and ponies, mare or gelding, 15 years old and over.

This class will be split at the Championships into the following sections:

- a) *Horses/Ponies 15 -21 years old*
- b) *Horses/Ponies Over 21 years old*

The highest placed THREE exhibitors not already qualified and with a valid 2010 Equestrian Life Registration Card will qualify for the Championships

Class 9: Ridden Mountain and Moorland Small and Large Breeds

Open to pure breeds only. Mare or gelding, four years old and over

NO STALLIONS ALLOWED Rider's to be a suitable size and weight for the pony.

Lead Rein Ponies are NOT permitted to enter this class.

This class will be split at the Championships into the following sections:

- a) *Small Breeds: Shetland, Dartmoor, Exmoor, Welsh Section A and B.*
- b) *Large Breeds: Highland, Dales, Fell, New Forest, Connemara, Welsh Section C and D.*

The highest placed THREE exhibitors not already qualified and with a valid 2010 Equestrian Life Registration Card will qualify for the Championships

Class 10: Ridden Coloured

PLEASE NOTE Roans, Duns, Cremello and Palomino horses and ponies are not permitted to enter the Ridden Coloured Class

Open to Piebald/Skewbald horses and ponies, mare or gelding, four years old and over, any height.

The wearing of spurs is allowed in these classes but no child under 14 years old may wear them

This class will be split at the Championships into the following sections:

- a) *148cms and under.*
- b) *over 148cms*

The highest placed THREE exhibitors not already qualified and with a valid 2010 Equestrian Life Registration Card will qualify for the Championships

Class 11: Lead Rein Pony

Open to ponies not exceeding 122cms, mare or gelding, four years old and over.

Rider's not to have attained their 9th birthday on the 1st January in the current year. To be led by an attendant aged 14 years old and over. To be shown in a snaffle bridle, lead rein to be attached to the noseband and not to the bit.

This class will be split at the Championships into the following sections:

- a) *Plaited*
- b) *Mountain & Moorland*

The highest placed THREE exhibitors not already qualified and with a valid 2010 Equestrian Life Registration Card will qualify for the Championships

Class 12: First Ridden Pony

Open to ponies not exceeding 128cms, mare or gelding, four years old and over.

Rider's not to have attained their 12th birthday on the 1st January in the current year.

To be shown in any suitable snaffle bridle.

This class will be split at the Championships into the following sections:

- a) *Plaited*
- b) *Mountain & Moorland*

The highest placed THREE exhibitors not already qualified and with a valid 2010 Equestrian Life Registration Card will qualify for the Championships

Class 13: Best Ridden Pony

Open to ponies exceeding 128cms but not exceeding 148cms, mare or gelding, four years old and over. NO MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND PONIES ALLOWED IN THIS CLASS

Rider's any age but must be a suitable size and weight for the pony.

This class will be split at the Championships into the following sections:

- a) *Ponies exceeding 128cms but not exceeding 138cms*
- b) *Ponies exceeding 138cms but not exceeding 148cms*

The highest placed THREE exhibitors not already qualified and with a valid 2010 Equestrian Life Registration Card will qualify for the Championships

Class 14: Ridden Cob

For horses over 148cms, open to mare or gelding, four years old and over. To be shown hogged and trimmed as appropriate. Judge may ride at qualifying shows and at the championships at the judges' discretion (the judge may elect NOT to ride certain exhibits).

The wearing of spurs is allowed in these classes but no child under 14 years old may wear them

This class will be split at the Championships into the following sections:

- a) *Exceeding 148cms but not exceeding 155cms*
- b) *Exceeding 155cms.*

The highest placed THREE exhibitors not already qualified and with a valid 2010 Equestrian Life Registration Card will qualify for the Championships

Class 15: Ridden Hunter

For horses exceeding 148cms. Open to mare or gelding, four years old and over.

The judge may ride at qualifying shows and at the championships at the judges' discretion (the judge may elect NOT to ride certain exhibits).

The wearing of spurs is allowed in these classes but no child under the age of 14 years old may wear them.

This class will be split at the Championships into the following sections:

- a) *Small Hunter to exceed 148cms but not to exceed 158cms*
- b) *Lightweight Hunter*
- c) *Heavyweight Hunter*

The highest placed THREE exhibitors not already qualified and with a valid 2010 Equestrian Life Registration Card will qualify for the Championships.

Class 16: Ridden Horse

For Horses 148cms and over, open to mare or gelding, four years old and over.

The judge may ride at qualifying shows and at the championships at the judges' discretion (the judge may elect NOT to ride certain exhibits).

The wearing of spurs is allowed in these classes but no child under 14 years old may wear them.

This class will be split at the Championships into the following sections:

- a) *Exceeding 148cms but not exceeding 158cms.*
- b) *Exceeding 158cms*

The highest placed THREE exhibitors not already qualified and with a valid 2010 Equestrian Life Registration Card will qualify for the Championships.

Class 17: Concours d'Elegance

THIS CLASS AT THE CHAMPIONSHIPS WILL BE JUDGED IN THE EVENING PERFORMANCE. ALL COMPETITORS WHO QUALIFY WILL COMPETE UNDER THE SPOTLIGHTS

Open to horses and ponies, mare or gelding, four years old and over. Rider's any age. To be Ridden astride or side saddle, Costumes or traditional allowed. To be judged on the overall picture of elegance presented by horse/pony and rider including appearance, conformation, and individual show. Judge may not ask for an individual show at their discretion.

This class will be split at the Championships into the following sections:

- a) Junior 16 years old and under to include Lead Rein competitors*
- b) Senior over 16 years old*

The highest placed THREE exhibitors not already qualified and with a valid 2010 Equestrian Life Registration Card will qualify for the Championships

Followed by: Ridden Championship

THIS IS NOT AN EQUESTRIAN LIFE QUALIFYING CLASS

1st and 2nd prize winners of classes 8 – 17 to qualify

Trophies to Champion and Reserve donated by 'Ray Smith Equine Back Specialist'. Feed vouchers donated by 'Blue Chip Feeds' to Champion & Reserve. 1 Horse or Human back treatment to the value of £50 donated by 'Ray Smith Equine Back Specialist' to the winner of the Ridden Championship class. 1 Rug wash or repair to the value of £25 donated by 'Stitch in Time' to Reserve Ridden Champion.

Don't forget to buy your qualification card before the day as there will only be a limited number of cards available at the show

The rules state that if you enter certain classes then you are not allowed to enter others – please check before entering

All class entries are £10 on the day, or £9 in advance
